



Home-School Agreement

The staff and governors warmly welcome you and your child into our school community. We believe in a strong partnership between school and parents/ carers, and are in fact, legally required to ask you to enter into an Agreement of Partnership.

Parents/ carers, like the school, have duties towards their children. We have set out these duties below as pledges, and include pledges for your child as well:

As a school:

We pledge that we will do our very best to make you feel welcome in school and to give you every opportunity to be involved in your child's learning. We will give you regular information about your child's progress and we will give you early notice of any concerns we may have about their learning, behaviour or relationships. We will seek, in every way, to give your child a highly effective education both academically and socially.

As a school, we will endeavour to:

- provide a safe and secure environment where children can be happy and successful
- care for your child as a valued member of the school community, irrespective of age; disability; gender reassignment; race; religion or belief; sex; or sexual orientation
- set high standards and provide a high quality education for your child
- encourage your child to achieve in all aspects of school life
- maintain a code of conduct which promotes a caring, secure and disciplined environment
- provide a broad and balanced curriculum, which is engaging, is matched to the needs of all, and makes learning enjoyable
- keep parents and carers informed about changes in the policies of the school and about general school matters

As a family:

We pledge we will accept the school's overall aims and objectives and positively support staff as they provide a highly effective education both academically and socially, for our child.

As a family, we will endeavour to:

- ensure regular attendance and punctuality, and provide explanations for absence
- ensure our child is ready to learn each day, having had enough sleep and a good breakfast
- support high standards of learning and behaviour

- ensure that the school has up-to-date information for emergency contact
- keep the school informed on end-of-day child collection arrangements, and support the code of conduct, which seeks to guarantee a caring, secure and disciplined environment
- let the school know of any problems which might affect our child's learning or behaviour
- attend parent-teacher consultations about our child's attainment and progress
- encourage our child in home learning tasks and other opportunities for home learning, including regularly listening to our child read
- support school community events
- raise any concerns about our child's education directly with the school, rather than voicing them on social media
- sign up to the school's communication systems e.g. Class Dojo, ParentMail
- support all School policies, so our child benefits.

As a child:

So this agreement between my family and my school is successful, I will:

- attend school regularly, on time and be ready to learn and take part in school activities. I can help myself by having enough sleep each night
- wear my uniform with pride
- co-operate with staff and accept the school's rules
- tell my class teacher or one of the adults in school straight-away if I have any concerns about anything
- work to the best of my ability, and allow others to do the same
- strive to make my parent(s)/carer(s) and the school proud of me
- consider and respect the feelings and property of other people in school and in the wider community
- care for grounds, buildings, furniture, equipment and books provided at school.
